

Our mission is to provide services which promote healing to children and their families who have experienced abuse through intervention, treatment and prevention.


Intern Job Description

Our Purpose:

- Minimize trauma to child victims of suspected child abuse or witness to violence
- Coordinate a collaborative response to cases of child abuse
- Help children heal from their trauma
- Work to increase community awareness of and how to prevent child abuse in our community

We accomplish this through:

- 1. Forensic Interviews Our specially trained interviewers conduct child-friendly forensic interviews with child victims in order to minimize the number of times children must tell their stories. All interviews are conducted using the legally sound, evidenced based SC Child First method.
- 2. Medical Evaluations Our specially trained nurse practitioner conducts medical evaluations to ensure the health and safety of the children, to document any evidence of abuse, and to refer for additional care as needed.
- **3. Mental Health Services** Our therapists offer specialized trauma-focused, evidence-based mental health services to assist the children and families cope with the trauma and to help them through the healing process.
- **4.** Advocacy/Case Management Our child advocate focuses on the needs of the children and the non-offending caregiver(s) by providing needed moral support and links to other community resources that the family may need.
- **5. Prevention** Our staff offers education, prevention and community awareness presentations and trainings on relevant and vital child safety issues.
- **6. Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT)** We coordinate our local MDT. The MDT is made up of a group of professionals who work together in a coordinated manner to ensure an effective response to reports of child abuse and neglect. Team members are from child protection, law enforcement, solicitor's office, school system, healthcare, mental health and other community agencies. Our MDT meets bi-weekly to discuss action plans for recent investigations and updates on past cases.



Purpose of Internship

Undergraduate Intern Learning Outcomes:

- Become familiar with policies and procedures for the CACAC and have an understanding of the overall community response to child maltreatment.
- Become familiar with direct service components of victim advocacy, forensic evaluation, case management and tracking crisis response and treatment through a continuum of care program.
- Begin to develop his/her own personal client interaction style and philosophy. Be able to further develop his/her interpersonal communication and administrative skills.
- Participate in at least one experience through each of the following: clerical duties, data collection/outcome
 measurement, grant management, special event planning/fundraising/marketing, operations management
 (policies, budgeting, etc.), prevention education, child/caregiver interactions at various points throughout the
 crisis response cycle, interactions with community collaborators and training/workshop presentations.
- Participate in agency staffing's, multi-disciplinary team meeting, and training/workshops to be able to understand clinical interaction and supervision, as well as group/community psychodynamics and collaboration.

Qualifications

All applicants must:

- Complete an application, background check, and reference check.
- Students should have completed coursework in human development, family studies, and other fields related to working with at-risk youth and adults.
- Sign a confidentiality form and maintain a high level of confidentiality at all times
- Be able to commit to approx. 10 hrs/week during our regular office hours, with preference given to those students who are able to be on-site Tuesday mornings to attend all mandatory staff and clinical meetings.
- Dress in a manner that is appropriate to greet the public and represent the organization.
- Bicultural and bilingual students are strongly encouraged to apply.

Essential Job Duties and Responsibilities - CAC Office Hours = Monday-Friday 9am-5pm

<u>General Office</u> - Duties may include, but not limited to: Answer phones, enter information in the computer, assist with filing and organizing paperwork, prepare caregiver packets, and cleaning up as needed.

<u>Client/Caregiver Interaction</u> - Duties may include: Calling caregivers for appointment reminders, helping caregivers' complete paperwork, talking with the child and or families before the interview, completing a needs assessment with caregivers while the children are being interviewed, helping caregivers complete the exit survey and conducting follow-up calls and connecting non-offending caregivers with resources in the community. Interns may also observe Forensic Interviews (FI), Medical Evaluations and assist staff with FI reports and data input as well as and assisting staff in conducting support groups with children and/or caregivers.

<u>Community Education and Prevention</u> - Duties may include: This volunteer/intern position may assist the Director, or other staff members in providing child abuse prevention trainings, informational fairs and/or workshops in the community.

Other Considerations

- It is important that all prospective interns understand this is a specialized population and interns will be
 working with clients and family members suffering from trauma related to child sexual abuse, other child
 abuse and neglect, and witness to violent crimes (including homicide and accidental death, grief and loss). The
 trauma experienced can be very complex and challenging, yet very rewarding.
- It is critical for interns to be open and honest with their supervisor about their feelings and reactions to what they see and/or hear throughout the day. They must also be emotionally stable and engage in self-care on a regular basis.
